Building Better Wheelchairs

With dedication, hard work and a positive attitude, we have found opportunity within Nicaragua's ongoing struggles. Difficulties importing chairs and parts forced us to develop more capacity within our team. We've done so, with a high level of quality, by hosting a World Health Organization (WHO) wheelchair course and extending collaborations with a International Society of Wheelchair Professionals (ISWP) trainer and also with local metal workers, bicycle shop owners and upholsterers. As a result, we now refurbish and create custom cushions and parts. We can build a complete, high quality chair from nothing more than an old frame. Christian, the co-trainer from Managua, is assisting us to insure even children with more complex needs receive appropriate chairs with a customized fit!



In August, we hosted a dynamic, practical and informative one-week WHO wheelchair provision course for 21 participants from 8 organisations across Nicaragua – including 5 wheelchair users who provided great perspectives. Dynamic, practical, informative, we learned theory and then applied it through hands on practice!
